A Message from Bethell Hospice



This past year was full of change and progress at Bethell Hospice, both strategically and operationally.

We also welcomed new leadership with new Board Chair, Debbie Davis, and new Executive Director, Nazira Jaffer.

As we look back, this has been a year of transition as many new seeds were planted, nurtured and have begun to sprout and bear fruit. We began to prepare for our accreditation, including the review of approximately 1700 policies, protocols and operational processes. These activities prepared us for our accreditation survey in May 2017, which was very successful. The surveyors were extremely impressed with our hospice and the services that we provide to our clients. We are proud to announce that we received our three year accreditation from CARF International.



This year, we updated our strategic plan, adopting three guiding principles:

- Excellence in Community Palliative Care and Residential Hospice Services – a system-wide need for comprehensive and integrated care is emerging; Bethell Hospice will provide leadership and support in the Central West Local Health Integration Network (CWLHIN) in palliative care and align with their priorities
- Quality, Safety and Efficiency – dedicated to strengthening patient and family experiences; commitment to the provision of optimum quality of life of the dying with dignity and respect
- Growth and Sustainability – commitment to building on our successes through advancement, innovation and thoughtful engagement

Our strategic plan was based on three distinct directions:

- Client and Family-Centered Palliative Care that is Seamless and Accessible – provide exemplary hospice palliative care that focuses on the whole person, and is seamless and accessible; with the focus on client and family centered care, Bethell Hospice will continue to ensure equitable and timely access to all our programs and services
- Visionary Leadership and Human Resources within a Renewed Organizational Culture – enhance the leadership to enable change and facilitate innovation to improve the effectiveness of the organization; strengthen the operational infrastructure that will focus on developing a trans-disciplinary, diverse, and learning and knowledge-focused organization; build capacity for palliative care leadership and human resources for care giver support
- Organizational Resiliency – ensure the organization has the resources required to meet its goals and objectives



With the updated strategic plan in place, we began the journey of our organizational cultural transformation and aligned this with the appropriate human resources, structure, skill sets, training, policies and processes.

Within human resources, we continue to value our most important assets – our people: our employees and volunteers. We introduced a pension plan for employees. We recruited new employees, including two social workers, and over 40 new volunteers. As part of our education plan, we conducted several Lunch and Learn sessions and offered two training days for our employees, and the first-ever training day for our volunteers, which included the deployment of volunteer kits and training materials. All of these activities support our ongoing efforts to continuously improve, and align with our strategy of making Bethell Hospice a ‘learning organization’.



We continue to explore new and innovative ways to improve access for our clients and have introduced several new programs:

- Child and Youth Bereavement Programs
- Your Story Matters: Journaling Through Grief Program
- Death Cafés within the community
- Caregiver Cafés and Movie Nights
- Children’s Bereavement Groups
- Ethnic Cuisine for the diverse community clients we serve

Additionally, several capital projects were undertaken with the financial support of the CWLHIN. Some of these projects include:

- establishing a cloud-based IT platform with upgraded hardware for employees in addition to two laptops for our volunteers
- installation of a nurse call bell system to support the clinical team working with clients in the residential program
- installation of a new telephone system





We would like to extend our thanks to our employees, volunteers, community partners, funders, and donors for making Bethell Hospice an outstanding resource for our community. We are also extremely appreciative of the fundraising work done, on behalf of Bethell Hospice, by the Bethell Hospice Foundation. Without their support, we could not continue to provide the services of Bethell Hospice to those who have an unmet need.

The pursuit of excellence in palliative care and end-of-life care is what will make the difference for our clients and families. Our collective achievements demonstrate our commitment to pursue excellence in everything we do.

We continue to be leaders in palliative and end-of-life care in the Central West LHIN, building partnerships that will have a lasting and positive impact for our clients, families and partners at all levels. 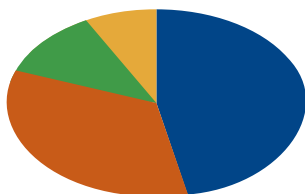


Community Program

In 2016 – 2017, Bethell Hospice served 1043 individuals through our Community and Psychosocial Spiritual Programs, representing 2756 service units. Three adult bereavement support groups were held, serving 20 participants. A social worker joined the Community Program team in December 2016, enhancing our ability to provide care in the community.

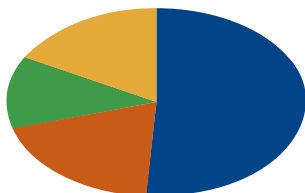


Residential Care Program

Bethell House welcomed 174 residents in 2016-2017, representing an average occupancy rate of 92%. The average length of resident stay was 13 days. Purchases of a blanket warmer and bladder scanner positively impacted resident care. Feedback from family members continued to be positive and thankful. Follow-up surveys with families were converted to an electronic format, and response rates have increased.

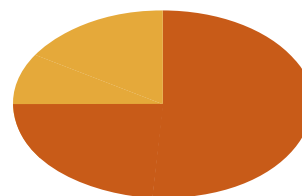


Residential Care Program, Psychosocial Services

A social worker joined the Residential Program team in January 2017 to provide psychosocial support to residents, their families and friends. This new program provided face-to-face anticipatory and bereavement services to 114 individuals, comprised of 30 residents and 84 families and friends. 265 visits were provided from January 3 to March 31, 2017.

Volunteer Program

In 2016 -2017, 44 new volunteers joined our team, bringing our roster of active volunteers to 156 individuals by March 31, 2017. These volunteers contributed 15,400 combined service hours to the organization. Our volunteers range in age from 15 to 88, and speak a combined total of thirteen different languages. Simple massage and aromatherapy was added as the fourth modality in our complementary therapy program, and complementary therapy volunteers are now in house four days each week. The HPCO online training platform increased accessibility to volunteer training, resulting in 38 volunteers trained since October 2016.

- Six Lunch & Learn activities were provided for staff and volunteers, with *Persuasive Communication* and *The Nature of Suffering & Loss* being the most popular

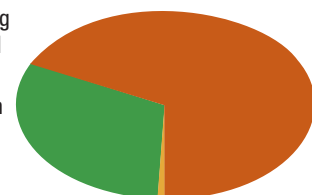

- Quarterly Volunteer / Executive Director Forums were held to give volunteers opportunities to discuss ideas and concerns directly with the Executive Director
- Six Volunteer Information Sessions and six Volunteer Trainings were conducted
- South Asian Community Forums offered workshops and keynote addresses to staff, volunteers, and community members in February 2017
- New trainings on *Ethnic Food Cuisine*, *Therapeutic Touch*, and *Grief Support for Children & Teens* were hosted for staff and volunteers
