The past year has been an exciting one with many changes for hospice palliative care.

The Ontario Ministry of Health and Long-Term Care announcement of a proposed investment of \$75 million over three years for end-of-life care is welcome news. Work is underway within the province to establish the Ontario Palliative Care Network, a new body to advance patient-centered care and develop provincial standards to strengthen services. The Ontario Palliative Care Network is a partnership among Cancer Care Ontario, Ontario's Local Health Integration Networks, Health Quality Ontario and other partners from diverse settings, including Bethell Hospice.

At Bethell Hospice, there have been changes as well. We have bid farewell to Executive Director, Nilda Patey, and wish her every success in her future endeavours. Our team continues to comply with the standards as we live our values on our journey to becoming a fully accredited organization.

2015-2016 Highlights

Resident Care Program

Bethell Hospice was home to 157 residents during the 2015-2016 year. Average occupancy was 86% and average length of stay was 23 days. 75% of our residents were over the age of 65, and 86% of residents had a cancer diagnosis.



Community Services

Throughout 2015-2016, we continued our commitment to strengthen community services, serving 185 community clients through a total of 2033 home visits. 509 clients were also served through our psychosocial spiritual care program, with a total of 1842 visits.



Psychosocial Spiritual Care

Serving Bethell Hospice, Heart House Hospice, Dufferin Hospice and Hospice Vaughan, our newly-funded spiritual care program provided personal end-of-life counselling and support to both clients and their caregivers. Services also included grief and bereavement counselling, both individually and in group settings. The spiritual care program also provided 14 educational workshops for our community partners, staff and volunteers, and at the Central West Palliative Care Network's annual conference.

Lunch & Learn Sessions

Through our popular Lunch & Learn Series, educational sessions on Spiritual Resiliency, Physician Assisted Death, and Personality Dimensions were delivered to appreciative audiences. Attendance averaged 34 participants per session and feedback was extremely positive. Participants included colleagues from other community organizations, interested members of the community, staff and volunteers. Owing to its tremendous popularity and success, the Lunch & Learn series will be expanded for the 2016-2017 year.



The South Asian Community Outreach Project

Now in its second year, the South Asian Community Outreach Project is a three year, Trillium-funded project that aims to educate and improve access to care within the South Asian Community. Bethell Hospice, Heart House Hospice and Punjabi Community Health Services jointly deliver the programming.

The second South Asian Community Education Forum was held on February 9, 2016 at the Sagan Convention Centre in Mississauga. Of special interest, to all those within the CW-LHIN who provide service within the South Asian Community, 125 participants gathered to gain insight into providing culturally-appropriate palliative care.

An inspiring keynote speech was delivered by Dr. Chandrakanthan, Bioethicist for the Centre of Clinical Ethics and University of Toronto, Joint Centre for Bioethics, and Associate Professor in the Department for the Study of Religion. He addressed the audience on one of his areas of special interest – South Asian Religio-Cultural and Ethical Perspectives on Palliative and End of Life Care.

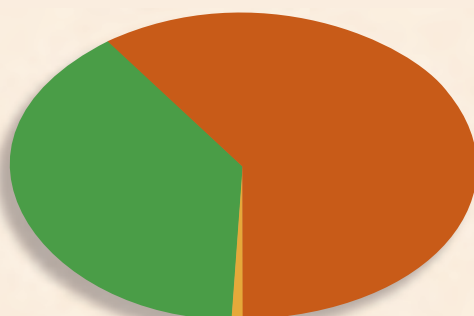

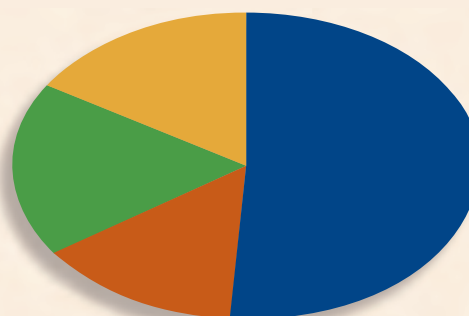
