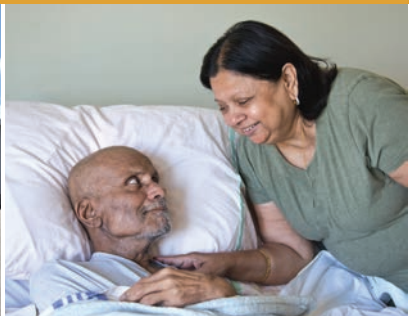

A Message from Bethell Hospice

This past year was a year of positive transitions and achievements for Bethell Hospice, with significant changes and improvements.

We enhanced our ability to serve our clients with flexibility and responsiveness, both in our residence and in the community. We formally received our CARF accreditation results in June 2017, with a three-year designation status. The accreditation process led to a pathway of continuous improvement, involving review of 1700 policies, protocols and related operational processes. We have now also completed our one-year quality conformance requirements, and received endorsement from CARF International. These results were due to the dedicated effort of all our staff and volunteers.



This year, we also refreshed and updated our strategic plan, based on three distinct directions:

- **Client and Family-Centered Palliative Care that is Seamless and Accessible** – provide exemplary hospice palliative care that focuses on the whole person, and is seamless and accessible; continue to focus on client and family-centered care to ensure equitable and timely access to all our programs and services
- **Visionary Leadership and Human Resources within a Renewed Organizational Culture** – enhance the leadership to enable change and facilitate innovation to improve the effectiveness of the organization; strengthen the operational infrastructure that will focus on an interdisciplinary, diverse, learning and knowledge-focused organization; build capacity for palliative care leadership and human resources for care giver support
- **Organizational Resiliency** – ensure the organization has the resources required to meet its goals and objectives



Nine strategic priority action items were established:

- Continue to improve awareness for access and capacity for palliative care in the Central West LHIN
- Explore innovative models of care to improve access
- Continue to create a culture that embraces innovation, partnership and collaboration
- Continue our human resource plan enhancement
- Continue on our quality improvement journey
- Continue to enhance our volunteer program
- Continue to build partnerships
- Embark on our capital plan
- Plan for the future expansion and alignment



We continue to explore new and innovative ways to improve access for our clients, and have introduced several new programs:



- Children's bereavement support groups
- Death Cafés within the community
- Tele-bereavement support through the Ontario Telemedicine Network (OTN)
- Tele-palliative support program
- Cooking for One program
- Enhanced wellness and complementary therapies
- Music therapy program in the residence
- Addition of art therapy to our children and youth programs
- Educational programs for staff, volunteers and clients

Finally, we developed our capital replacement plan, along with our risk register and risk plan, as we look ahead to the next year.

We would like to take this opportunity to thank all our staff, volunteers, community partners, funders, our Foundation and donors in supporting us to make Bethell Hospice a leader in palliative care in our region.

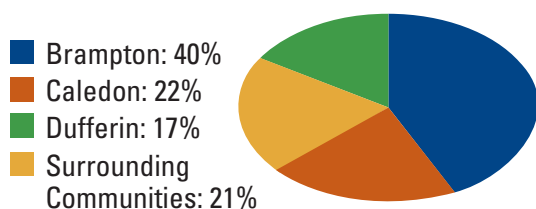


Community Program

In 2017-18, Bethell Hospice served 513 individuals through our Community Program, representing 1261 service units. Psychosocial Spiritual Care Coordinators provided Palliative and Bereavement care to 462 individuals, providing 1444 units of care. The Community Social Worker delivered one-on-one and family support to palliative clients in their homes or at one of our community offices.

Five adult bereavement support groups were held, as well as two children's bereavement support groups and our first ever teen's bereavement support group. In total, these groups served 53 participants. Monthly drop-in bereavement support, using OTN (Ontario Telemedicine Network) video conferencing, was also initiated, serving 11 participants online. Numerous activity-based programs were also offered through the year, including Cooking for One, Grief in the Garden, Mourning Walks, and Movies for Caregivers.

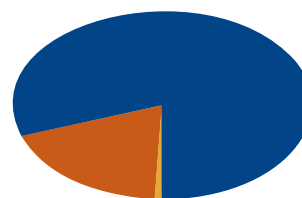
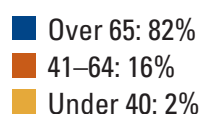
Community Program, Services by Geographic Region



Residential Care Program

Bethell House welcomed 156 residents in 2017-2018 representing an average occupancy rate of 88%. The average length of resident stay was 20.8 days. 85% of our residents were admitted with a cancer diagnosis, and 15% with a non-cancer diagnosis.

Residential Care Program, Age of Clients Served

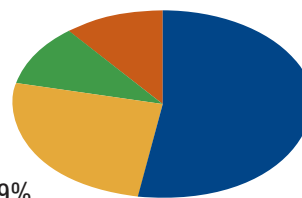
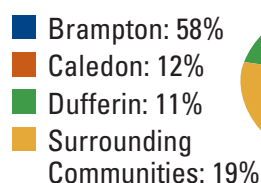


A Music Therapy program was initiated in February 2018, bringing a Music Therapist into the residence each week to provide group and individual services.

Based on responses from our Resident Care Satisfaction Survey*, 98.6% of families receiving end-of-life care at our Bethell Hospice Residence rated their experiences as 'Excellent' and the likelihood of recommending Bethell Hospice to friends and family as 'Very High'. Many of our Bethell House families have also shared their experiences within their community, resulting in 493 new referrals in 2017-2018.

Residential Care Program, Psychosocial Services

Residential Social Work Services provided psychosocial support to 671 individuals, including residents, their families and friends, representing 1323 service units. Most of this support was offered face-to-face in the residence during visits with the resident, but also included a small amount (3% of total) of telephone and email support, as required. Residential Social Work Services also supported families and the clinical team by holding family meetings, assisting with intake assessments, and attending meetings with outside professionals.



Volunteer Program

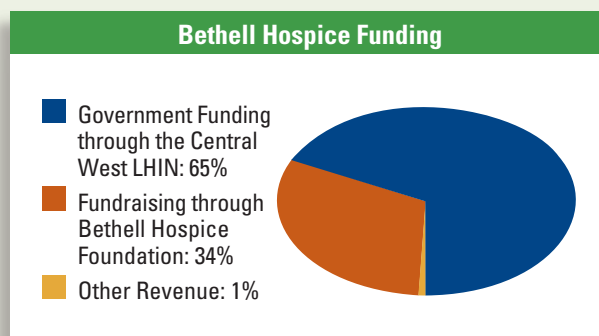
In 2017-2018, 37 new volunteers joined our team, bringing the number of active volunteers to 170 individuals by March 31, 2018. Bethell Hospice volunteers contributed 16,880 hours to the organization, an increase of almost 10% over the previous year. Our volunteers range in age from 22 to 90, and speak a combined total of 13 different languages.

Education Program

Bethell Hospice sees itself as a 'learning organization', and prioritizes on-going education and support of staff and volunteers. Highlights of our robust educational program included the following opportunities:

- 16 Lunch & Learn sessions were provided to staff and volunteers, including *Having Difficult Conversations* and *Dementia & Communication*
- Quarterly Volunteer / Executive Director Forums were held to give volunteers opportunities to discuss ideas and concerns directly with the Executive Director
- Four Volunteer Information Sessions and four 12-hour Volunteer Trainings were conducted
- Volunteer Training Day at Hockey Valley Resort focused on *Multi-Faith Practices at End of Life*, *Music Therapy*, and *Advanced Care Planning*
- Staff Training Day at Hockey Valley Resort focused on *DiSC Personality Training*, *Multi-Faith Practices at End of Life*, *Music Therapy*, and *Advanced Care Planning*
- Two Death Cafés were held in Brampton to encourage the public to speak about death and dying
- A workshop was presented to the Hospice Palliative Care Conference on *Psychosocial Conversations by Palliative Performance Scale*
