A Message from Bethell Hospice Foundation



Bethell Hospice Foundation welcomed 2024 with great enthusiasm and positivity

We completed the first year of a five-year plan focusing on growth and long-term sustainability.

We invested in tools to support our traditional fundraising initiatives and diversified our communication and stewardship efforts to ensure we stayed personally connected to our supporters.

It is the responsibility of the Foundation to provide donors, sponsors, and volunteers with the best possible return on your investment in us. Whether that be your time, expertise, financial support or all three, we want you to know that your contribution made a significant impact. In fact, we are happy to report that in 2024, we were able to cross the \$2 million fundraising revenue milestone for the first time and limit expense growth to close out the year in a strong financial position.

Some highlights of the year included our 14th annual spring Hike for Bethell Hospice event which raised over \$245,000.

To promote accessibility to this popular community event, we made the decision to waive registration fees. Not only did we increase our attendance, we surpassed the previous year's donations by \$15k! Also, we more than doubled our student involvement in the hike by welcoming twelve elementary schools who contributed over \$20k to the initiative!

Dufferin Impact by Numbers

Bethell Hospice was proud to serve 249 (total)
Dufferin residents through our programs and
services this year. Our community-based programs
provided care to 204 individuals and our Hospice
Residence was home to 45 clients and their families.




Increasing Awareness through Community Connections

Bethell Hospice Resident Story

Eric Copeland

Despite all the challenges he faced in life, Eric was fiercely independent. In fact, in December 2024, at the young age of 25, Eric made the decision to spend his end-of-life journey at Bethell Hospice.

Eric was almost 10 when he was diagnosed with cancer. His fierce determination to live life his own way though led to many incredible accomplishments, including overcoming several learning challenges.

His mom Sharon describes his abilities.

"I knew his potential. If you can drive a car when people say you can't, pass high school when told you don't have the ability, and play a set of drums, even though you're not the most coordinated kid, you just keep defying the odds."

One of Eric's last wishes was to be home for Christmas before transferring to Bethell Hospice. Arriving at the hospice on Boxing Day, Sharon explained the ease of the transfer,

"Dr. Gagnon was the palliative care doctor in the community, and he knew Eric before he entered the hospice. It was really an integrated service experience which made the transition to the hospice that much easier. Dr. Gagnon understood Eric and respected his request to die in dignity." When he arrived, Eric decided to sit in the Lazy Boy chair rather than transfer to a hospice bed. As a young resident, Eric was welcomed warmly by the volunteers and the care team. On the first morning, Eric surprised the volunteers by asking for toast with marmalade. He explained that his mom's parents were British so of course he knew all about marmalade.

Sharon believes Eric was a bit of a novelty.

"Being mothers themselves, a lot of the staff and volunteers could relate, and they realized how hard this was for our family, and how hard it was for him. He was a young person dying but he could also articulate his wants and needs."

One of the hospice volunteers found out that Eric enjoyed appetizers and charcuterie boards and asked him what he would normally do to celebrate New Year's Eve at home.

Together, the two of them set out to design

a special menu and the volunteer stayed



Eric died on January 26, 2025, exactly one month after entering the hospice.

Since Eric's passing, Sharon has had the opportunity to meet with the Bethell Hospice Supportive Care team to process her grief.

Participating in the annual spring Hike for Bethell Hospice fundraiser has also proven helpful for Sharon and her daughter. The family participated as Team Eric #4 (the hospice room where Eric resided). Sharon commented on the hike

"The hike was good therapy, and it really helped my daughter a lot. We connected with other families who had also spent time at the hospice."



She went on to explain,

"When Eric died, another resident family member showed his respect and understanding by placing his hand over his heart and making the symbol of praying when we walked past him. When I saw him again at the hike, I was able to express my gratitude and thanks."







The power of community is evident each spring when hikers, sponsors, volunteers, families and friends take to the Caledon Trailway to honour and celebrate the lives of those they loved.

Sunday, May 5 was no exception, as participants of the 14th Annual Hike for Bethell Hospice gathered at the Lloyd Wilson Centennial Arena in Inglewood to raise a phenomenal \$245,000 in support of this signature event.

Foundation Board Co-Chairs, Adrian Horwood and Bonnie Klaassen welcomed hikers during the opening ceremony, and MPP for Dufferin-Caledon, Sylvia Jones read a poem titled "Walking Memories for the Future" which touched upon the purpose and spirit of the hike. Town of Caledon Ward 1 Area Councillor, Lynn Kiernan, read a proclamation declaring the day as the start of Hospice Palliative Care Week, raising awareness for hospice care in all Caledon communities.

This was also the second year that local Caledon elementary schools took part in their own 'Student Hike for Bethell Hospice' with 5400 students hiking around school playground areas and within the

local community. The twelve schools contributed over \$20k to the initiative that provides community programming such as children and youth grief counselling services and Art Therapy for children.
