Our Hospice Residence's 15th anniversary year marks our highest level of impact to date. We welcomed a record 197 residents to our hospice and supported a record 802 community clients through our supportive care programs.



Since opening our 10-bed Hospice in Inglewood in 2010, Bethell Hospice has cared for 2,400 residents and touched the lives of more than 10,000 people through our residence programs alone.

These numbers represent more than service volumes; they reflect moments of comfort, connection, and meaning for people across our communities.

We are especially proud of the ways Bethell Hospice strengthened its role within the broader palliative care system. Through collaboration with the Hills of Headwaters Ontario Health Team and the Dufferin Area Family Health Team, we helped lead the Palliative Care Central Intake Program, creating clearer pathways to care. Our partnership with Headwaters Health Care Centre also helped connect more people with hospice and supportive care earlier in their journey. With an investment from Ontario Health, we also expanded professional grief and bereavement support for adults, children, youth, and families in Brampton and Caledon.

Looking ahead, the Board and leadership team are developing a refreshed five-year strategic plan to guide our next chapter. This work will help us respond to evolving community needs, strengthen partnerships, support our people, and sustain the exceptional care that defines Bethell Hospice.

A Message from Bethell Hospice Foundation



Bethell Hospice Foundation ushered in 2025-2026 with a spirit of reflection and celebration.

2025 marked the 15th Anniversary of Bethell Hospice and the year had us celebrating our past while laying the groundwork for continued success in the future.

The Foundation works hard to provide our donors, sponsors, and volunteers with the best possible experience and outcomes. We are so proud of the relationships we have forged and grown over the years, and nothing makes us happier than when we can report successes in our fundraising efforts.

We are thrilled to share that, for the second year in a row, the Foundation raised over \$2 million in revenue while controlling our expenses. This allowed the Foundation to transfer a record amount of \$1,333,985 to Bethell Hospice.

2025/26 featured a series of signature and community events, including hike, golf, hockey, euchre, curling, cycling, tubing, BBQ events, and so many more creative community fundraisers! Our spring Hike for Bethell Hospice raised over \$260,000 and welcomed well over 500 participants! We also expanded our student engagement to 5300 students from 13 schools. These young supporters and their families contributed nearly \$20,000 through the school hike, while also raising awareness of hospice care and Bethell Hospice among youth.

We held our signature golf tournament at the prestigious TPC Toronto at Osprey Valley, bringing in over \$100K! Our popular Diamond in the Hills Fashion Show netted over \$330,000 in proceeds, and our board-led Holiday Market raised over \$25,000! Despite the continued challenges of a nationwide postal strike, our annual Celebration of Light & Love campaign raised over \$246,000, thanks especially to a generous matching gift from long-time donors Luisa and Jim Mocon.

Although we had many initiatives to celebrate, a highlight was the garden party celebrating the 15th Anniversary of the Bethell Hospice residence. In considering how to celebrate this milestone, we asked the question "What would Lorna Bethell do?" The answer was clear: an outdoor garden tea party to welcome back founding and long-time donors, staff and volunteers. This afternoon event featured all the elements of a traditional high tea, along with volunteer-led tours of the stunning gardens for which Bethell Hospice has become known.

Bethell Hospice Highlights 2025/2026

Legacy and Impact: Looking Back with Gratitude

For more than three decades, Bethell Hospice has been shaped by a simple but powerful commitment: to walk alongside individuals and families in our community during some of life's most difficult moments.



Our story began with the founding of community-based Hospice Caledon in 1991 and grew into the opening of our 10-bed hospice residence, now known as Bethell Hospice. Through every stage of that journey, compassionate care has remained at the heart of our work – and it is our people who have made that care possible.



That legacy lives on in the dedication of our team. Ironically, we have 15 volunteers who have been sharing their compassion, skills and time with us for over 15 years. We also have three clinical staff members who have been at Bethell Hospice for 15 years and continue to serve our residents and families today. These staff include two of our original nurses, Joyce and Margaret, and Dorothy who has contributed in several nursing and leadership roles and is currently one of our Intake Coordinators.

Since opening our hospice residence, we have cared for 2,400 residents. When we include their loved ones and family members, more than 10,000 people have been touched by our residence programs alone. With the addition of our supportive care community clients, Bethell Hospice's reach continues to grow each year.

The Last Year and the Path Ahead

This past year marked our highest level of impact to date. Bethell Hospice welcomed a record 197 admissions to the hospice residence and served 802 community clients through our supportive care programs.



We also strengthened our role as a trusted partner in the broader palliative care system. In collaboration with the Hills of Headwaters Ontario Health Team and the Dufferin Area Family Health Team, Bethell Hospice led the Palliative Care Central Intake Program, helping create clearer pathways to care for individuals and families.

Our partnership with Headwaters Health Care Centre further extended the reach of our services. By having one of our Social Workers, Anica, on-site to speak with outpatient oncology clinic patients every other week, we increased awareness of hospice and supportive care options and connected more people with the help they need earlier in their journey.



With an investment from Ontario Health, we also expanded our professional grief and bereavement services, including support for adults in North Brampton and children and youth in Caledon and Dufferin. This expansion reflects a growing recognition that hospice care extends beyond end-of-life support to include meaningful care for those who are grieving.

Together, these achievements reflect the courage, collaboration, and innovation that define Bethell Hospice – and point to the opportunities ahead.

To guide this next chapter, the Bethell Hospice Board and leadership team have begun developing a refreshed and updated five-year strategic plan. This work will help ensure we continue to respond to community needs, strengthen partnerships, and sustain the compassionate care that has defined Bethell Hospice for generations.

Susan & Mom – A Bethell Hospice Community Story

The Bethell Hospice social work team provides care and support to my critically ill mother, Jeannie, who recently celebrated her 90th birthday and is now homebound.

She eagerly looks forward to visits from her social worker, Kristen, and often shares how much these visits help her feel less isolated.

As her mobility and independence have declined, my mother has experienced disappointment, loneliness, and depression. She deeply misses the activities she once enjoyed, including gardening, visiting friends, travelling, and spending time with her beloved pet, who passed away last year.

Our family noticed a significant change in Mom's mood and outlook as her health challenges increased. Through her visits with her social worker, Kristen, we have seen a remarkable transformation. Kristen's compassion, understanding, and support have helped Mom become more patient, positive, and engaged with those around her. It has been wonderful to see her regain many of the qualities that have always made her such an interesting and caring person.

This year, through Bethell Hospice, we were also introduced to the St. John Ambulance Therapy Dog Program. Mom was absolutely delighted to meet Kathy and her gentle, well-behaved therapy dog, Elizabeth. Their visits brought her tremendous joy and comfort and brightened her days in a very special way.

As my mother's primary caregiver, I have also been fortunate to receive support from the Bethell Hospice social work team. Having someone to speak with has helped me navigate the grief, stress, and challenges that come with caring for a parent whose health is declining. The encouragement and guidance I have received have been invaluable and deeply appreciated.



In addition, I was encouraged to participate in Bethell Hospice's *Support Group for Caregivers*, a program for adults who provide care for loved ones. From the very first session, both the social workers and fellow participants created a welcoming and supportive environment. The program is thoughtfully designed, empowering, and incredibly helpful for caregivers facing similar challenges.

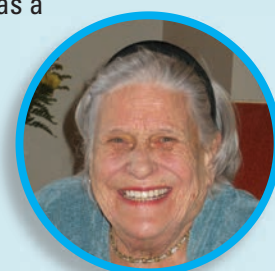
MacDougall spoke of one of the hospice's greatest strengths: its volunteers. Today, approximately 145 volunteers contribute countless hours supporting staff, residents, and families. From preparing meals and offering resident companionship to helping maintain the beautiful gardens, volunteers continue to play an essential role in delivering the compassionate care for which Bethell Hospice is known.

The impact of that care has been profound. Since opening in 2010, more than 2,400 individuals have received end-of-life care at Bethell Hospice, while another 11,000 people have been supported through community-based Supportive Care programs.

These numbers represent more than statistics – they tell the story of families finding comfort, connection, and support during some of life's most difficult moments.

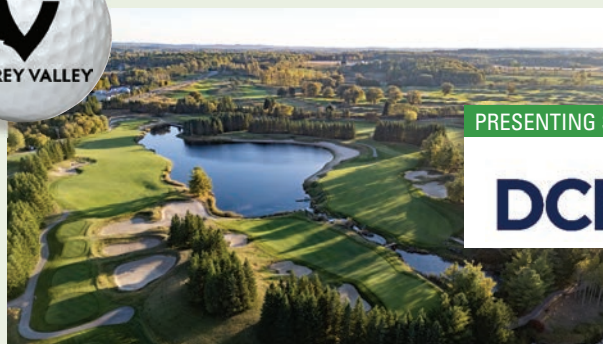
With many teams returning for the special occasion, the hike set a record by **raising over \$260,000.**
